RE: Livingston Farmers Association Pending Relocation and Potential Water Connection to the City of Livingston Public Water Supply System – Merced County

The purpose of this letter is to demonstrate the State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Drinking Water's (DDW) desire to have the City of Livingston provide water service to the pending public water system serving the relocated Livingston Farmer's Association. It is the Division's understanding that the Livingston Farmer's Association is currently located within in the city limits of the City of Livingston and water service is provided by the City. However, the Livingston Farmer's Association is relocating their facility to 11019 Eucalyptus Avenue, Livingston, CA, which is outside of the City's sphere of influence. Due to restrictions on extension of service contained in the current LAFCO law, the Merced County LAFCO has indicated they will not be able to approve the extension of service.

The Division determined the new facility will be a public water system. As such, the Livingston Farmer's Association is required to submit a technical report as required by Senate Bill 1263. One of the requirements of the SB1263 report is to evaluate the feasibility of connecting to an existing public water system within three miles of the proposed new public water system. In preparing the SB1263 Technical Report, the Livingston Farmer's Association outreached to the City of Livingston. It is the Division's understanding that the City of Livingston has indicated a willingness to provide public water service to the proposed new public water system. The Division supports the City and Livingston Farmer's Association in establishing a connection to the City of Livingston's public water supply system rather than forming a new public water system. The Division is hopeful the Livingston Farmer's Association can work with the City of Livingston and the Merced County LAFCO to facilitate the establishment of a water service to the new facility.

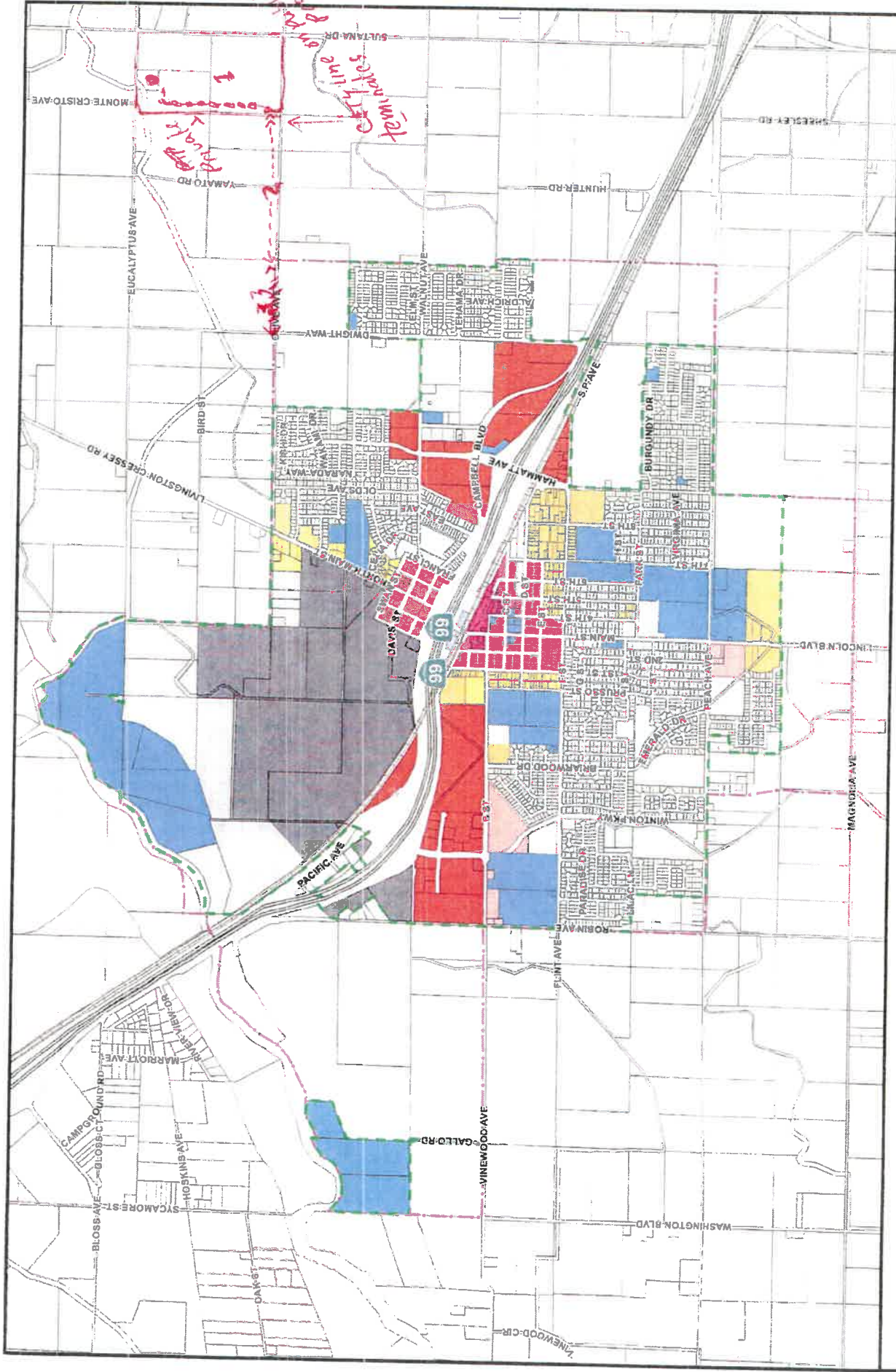
